

## Irregular Verbs in the “yo” form

Infinitive	“yo” form
Hacer = to do, make	hago
Poner = to put	pongo
Salir = to leave, go out	salgo
Traer = to bring	traigo
Traducir = to translate	traduzco
Ver = to see	veo
Tener = to have	tengo

These verbs are irregular in the “yo” form and then they are regular in the rest of the conjugation.

Example:

Hacer is an -ER verb

<b>Yo hago</b>	Nosotros <b>hacemos</b>
Tú <b>haces</b>	Vosotros <b>hacéis</b>
E.l/Ella/Ud. <b>hace</b>	Ellos/ellas/Uds. <b>hacen</b>

Tener is an -ER verb, irregular in the “yo form that you know already. (It is also a “stem-changing verb e→ie” a category we will see later in the semester.)

Tener = to have

<b>Yo tengo</b>	Nosotros <b>tenemos</b>
Tú <b> tienes</b>	Vosotros <b>tenéis</b>
E.l/Ella/Ud. <b>tiene</b>	Ellos/ellas/Uds. <b>tienen</b>
